

UNM Midwives: About Us

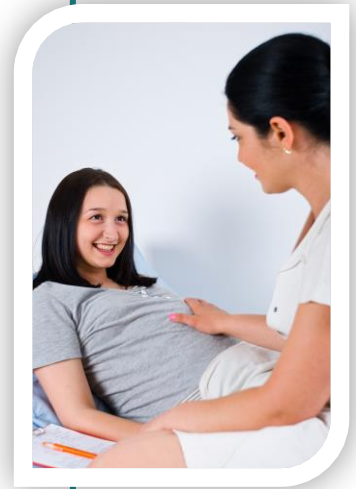
We welcome you and your family to our care! Here are some answers to questions you might have about us.

What Are Certified Nurse-Midwives (CNMs)?

- We provide health care for:
 - Pregnancy
 - Childbirth
 - Care after birth (postpartum care)
 - Well women exams (yearly check-ups for women)
 - Birth control
 - Menopause
 - Reproductive health counseling
- We studied nursing and midwifery in college.
- Some of us have a master's or a doctorate degree.
- We have passed a national test for CNMs and have certificates and licenses from the State of New Mexico.

How do midwives care for you?

- We get to know you and your family.
- We listen to you and respond to your physical and emotional needs.
- We provide comprehensive (complete) care. This includes ordering and reviewing lab tests and ultrasounds.
- We check up on you and your baby's health at each visit to make sure you have a healthy start together.
- We teach you and answer your questions.
- We respect your personal choices.
- We refer you to our team of doctors or other providers if you need it.
