The Family and Community Partnerships Division of the UNM/CDD is seeking an Education & Outreach Manager to oversee and manage a large multifaceted program known as Partners for Employment. The selected candidate will oversee multiple scopes of work and supervise personnel, including two Program Managers, who provide statewide training and technical assistance in best practices for supported employment and school-to-work transition for persons with intellectual/developmental disabilities (I/DD). The Education & Outreach Manager will oversee multiple contracts and serve as the principal point of representation and liaison with individuals, businesses, organizations

and state agencies.

This position is responsible for the oversight of annual contract deliverables, including developing and facilitating on-line and in-person trainings, hosting statewide meetings and providing technical assistance on the topics of supported employment and school-to-work best practices for individuals with I/DD. The Education & Outreach Manager will need to possess strong interpersonal and communication skills (oral and written) and the ability to work effectively with a wide range of constituencies in diverse communities. The individual who is hired for this position will need to have the ability to manage multiple projects, shifting priorities and meet monthly reporting deadlines. Project management, organization and coordination skills are strongly desired. This position requires regular statewide travel.

## **College of Employment Services FY22 Spring Cohorts**



The College of Employment Services (CES) is an innovative approach to training that is both comprehensive and flexible and is designed to meet the needs of busy staff who support individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. CES training is a 15-week course that combines online/self-paced training with live online discussion sessions.

The online training consists of 26.4 hours of content and is available ondemand 24/7. A high-speed internet connection, computer with camera and microphone is all that is needed to access the coursework.

\* Upon completion of the online coursework, participants will be eligible for a scholarship and technical assistance to pursue an ACRE certificate or take the CESP exam.
