Exciting changes coming to CESP

Eligible applicants for the Certified Employment Support Professional (CESP) exam **now** have two ways to take the exam.

First, **in person**. Through a partnership with KRYTERION Global Testing Services, APSE (The Association for People Supporting Employment) will offer the exam in person in Albuquerque, Farmington, and El Paso, TX. Second, **remote proctoring services**. With remote proctoring services, eligible applicants for the CESP exam will be able to take the exam in the comfort of their home.
